What is MART?

With MART you use the same inhaler as both your 'preventer' and your 'reliever'. Your healthcare professional should have written the details about how to use your MART inhaler in the section below.

Most people on MART do not need a separate 'blue reliever' inhaler; you use your MART inhaler as both your preventer and your reliever.

This card should be used with your personalised asthma action plan, which provides more information about your asthma treatment
